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POSTDOCTORAL ASSOCIATE

The Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence (<u>https://www.ycei.org</u>), part of the Child Study Center at the Yale School of Medicine, conducts research and teaches people of all ages how to develop their emotional intelligence. Our work focuses on (1) the development of social and emotional skills among diverse populations in education settings and organizations, and (2) the mechanisms by which social and emotional skills and training impact significant life outcomes.

We are seeking a highly motivated, full-time **Postdoctoral Associate** to join the interdisciplinary research team at the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence to support the How We Feel program of research. The primary object of the project is to investigate the context of daily feelings reported by users of the How We Feel app (how daily affect is related to where people are, what they are doing, and who they are with), longitudinal relations between daily feelings and well-being, and dynamics of daily affect and personality. The Postdoctoral Associate's primary responsibility will be to lead data curation, analyses, and writing research articles for publication in academic journals. Results will directly inform and impact the app design and emotion skills training it provides, as well as indirectly inform programs to build social and emotional skills in adult populations.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- (1) Oversee, conduct, and assist with quantitative data collection, curation, and analyses, including data management, cleaning and reporting.
- (2) Lead or participate in the design of future studies, literature reviews, and working with other team members to collect and analyze data.
- (3) Interpret and communicate results effectively in various formats.
- (4) Prepare and publish manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals and present research findings at conferences in areas relevant to the study, possibly in collaboration with other YCEI members.
- (5) Collaborate efficiently and effectively with other researchers.

The Project Director, Dr. Zorana Ivcevic Pringle, will oversee day-to-day work assignments and serve as the primary supervisor along with Dr. Marc Brackett. The Postdoctoral Associate will have flexibility to develop their specific research focus within the context of the project team's expertise and the needs of the larger project.

The Postdoctoral Associate position is a full-time appointment for one year, with full benefits, and with the possibility of renewal, dependent upon performance and availability of funding. This position is located at the Child Study Center on the campus of Yale University in New Haven, CT. In accordance with the university's postdoc office policy, all trainees are expected to complete their training on campus.

SKILLS & QUALIFICATIONS

The ideal candidate will have or demonstrate the following:

- Ph.D. in a relevant field or discipline such as psychology, sociology, or education
- Specialization or research experience in the study of emotions and/or relevant area
- Competence in quantitative research methods, including methods for longitudinal research, network analysis, and nominal data analysis
- Strong analytical skills and use of statistical packages and analyses (e.g., SPSS, R)
- Strong analytical and problem-solving skills, with the ability to work with large and complex datasets
- Strong track record of publications and research outputs commensurate with career stage
- Excellent writing skills demonstrated in academic publications
- Exceptional project management and organizational skills, including effective time management

- Ability to work both independently with minimal supervision and collaboratively
- Ability to interact and communicate effectively (e.g., through writing, presentations) with different audiences (research community, general public)

To be eligible for a postdoctoral appointment, candidates must hold a Ph.D., or equivalent degree from a program in relevant field or discipline. When a candidate has completed all the requirements for a degree, but the degree has not yet been formally conferred, the candidate may present evidence of completion of the degree, together with a statement of the date on which the degree is to be conferred.

The Postdoctoral Associate will benefit from mentorship on academic advancement and participate in multiple professional development trainings and opportunities (e.g., developing public speaking skills, attending YCSC postdoc seminar series, presenting research from the project at national or international conferences).
